## LILY'S CHICKEN YARD CHICKEN TIPS: CARE FOR YOUR NEW CHICKEN

Thank you for supporting us. Please follow this guide to insure that your new chicken is happy and healthy. This is only a guide and does not guarantee your chicken from discerning health issues.

- 1. When you receive your chicken, it will probably be very stressed from its trip. Gently handle them.
- 2. Your chicken will probably be very thirsty. DO NOT ALLOW THEM TO DRINK A LARGE AMOUNT OF WATER IN A SHORT PERIOD OF TIME. A slow progression of clean water should be provided. Allow them to slowly sip a few drinks here and there.
- 3. Make sure that you have a clean cage for your chicken.
- 4. DO NOT ALLOW THEM TO ROAM FREE OR PECK AT ANY DIRT.
- 5. You should slowly introduce a handful of dirt from where your chicken will be kept into a holding pen for your chicken to peck at. Your chicken needs to acclimate to the new bacteria in your area slowly.
- 6. Feed your chicken only clean feed. We use corn (cracked and whole) as a general feed and provide vegetables, fruits and commercial feed as a protein and fiber supplement. DO NOT JUST FILL A BUCKET WITH FOOD AND LEAVE IT FOR DAYS TO WEEKS ON IN. FEEDS WILL BECOME SPOILED.
- 7. Make sure your holding pen is large enough for your chicken.
- 8. Perches should not be higher than 1-2 feet for certain type of chickens. Adjust as necessary.
- 9. Make sure that your chicken is safe from predators. (Dogs, cats, foxes, coyotes, and other aggressive chickens or birds)
- 10. Happy chicken raising.

## EGG CARE

Thank you for support us. This is a general guide to care for your new eggs. This is not an inclusive guide.

- 1. There is never a guarantee for eggs to hatch after shipping. This is due to the handling of the eggs during transit.
- 2. If the eggs were handled roughly during transit, there is a possibility that no eggs will hatch at all.
- 3. NEVER WASH YOUR EGGS. Doing so will allow bacteria to enter the egg and affect the hatch rate.
- 4. You should always wash your hands with soap prior to and after handling any eggs. Oil and debris from your hands will affect the hatch rate.
- 5. When you receive your new eggs, open the package and carefully inspect all the eggs for damages.
- 6. Throw away cracked or broken eggs. We inspect all eggs prior to shipping.
- 7. DO NOT IMMEDIATELY PUT THE EGGS INTO AN INCUBATOR. Let the eggs acclimate to room temperature prior to placing them into an incubator.
- 8. Use your own incubating procedures as temperature and humidity differs in areas.
- 9. Rule of thumb; when chicks hatches, they should be stored in a brooding box/pen with a temperature of 95 degrees and lowered 4-5 degrees every weeks thereafter to around 80 degrees. We let ours out after about 12 weeks old.
- 10. Always provide clean water and feed for chicks. Water container should be cleaned and changed every day. Chick feeds should be change/clean out weekly.
- 11. Vigilantly maintaining a clean environment will help your chickens/chicks be happy and healthy.
